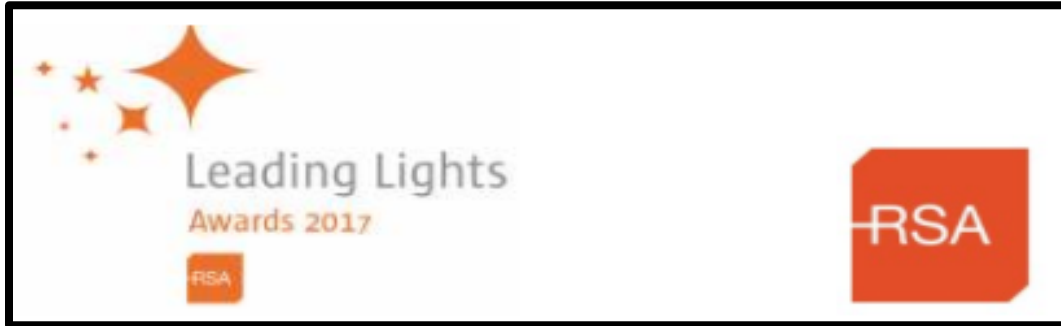


Dunboyne Senior Primary School

The RSA Leading Lights Awards recognise and honour the contribution made by people and organisations nationwide in reducing deaths and serious injuries on Irish roads. Our school has a proud tradition of promoting road safety awareness for many years. Our school promotes walk to school and cycle to school initiatives as well as road safety awareness as part of

our Active School and Healthy Ireland Health Promoting School initiatives.
